Dixon Police Officers responded to Hall Park on a report of a student with a gun. A patrol officer observed a subject on foot that matched the description of the subject provided by dispatch. As the officer exited the vehicle to confront the subject, the subject fired multiple rounds from a handgun at the officer, striking the officer's vehicle. The subject fled on foot while continuing to fire at the officer. The officer returned fire. The subject was apprehended by additional officers in the park after a brief foot pursuit. The subject was taken into custody without further incident. The subject was transported to Dixon Police Department, and read his rights per Miranda. The subject waived Miranda and told investigating officers that he intentionally shot at the police officer knowing that he might kill the officer. Officers recovered a loaded handgun from the suspect at the time of his arrest. Officers also located a second loaded handgun from a duffle bag the suspect was carrying with him at the time of this incident.

1 On 10/8/14 at about 0905 hrs I heard patrol officers dispatched to Hall Park for a report of a student with  
2 a gun near the skate park. The subject was described as a white male juvenile about six feet tall with  
3 short brown hair, a black sweater with a Jack Daniels design, blue sweatpants and a large backpack. I  
4 responded from the Dixon Police Department. While I was responding, Solano Dispatch advised Dixon  
5 High School had been placed in a lockdown and requested a unit respond there. I advised Solano  
6 Dispatch I would respond to the Dixon High School. I responded to Dixon High School code three.

7  
8 Upon my arrival at the Dixon High School I went to the north end of the high school parking lot where  
9 there is a pedestrian gate opening into the south end of Hall Park. As I arrived on scene, I heard Officer  
10 Siebert ask Solano Dispatch to repeat the suspect description via the radio. Solano Dispatch repeated the  
11 description of the suspect and Officer Siebert advised he was out with the subject on the east side of the  
12 park. I exited my vehicle and immediately heard three loud pops from the area north of me in Hall Park.  
13 I immediately recognized the sounds to be gunshots and I hear Officer Siebert call "shots fired" on the  
14 radio. Officer Siebert updated via the radio that the suspect was running northbound toward the  
15 swimming pool which was too far for me to respond to on foot. I returned to my vehicle and heard  
16 Officer Szmurlo advise via the radio he had one at gunpoint at the swimming pool and less than a  
17 minute later Officer Szmurlo advised the suspect was in custody.

18  
19 I was contacted at the Dixon High School by [REDACTED] who asked  
20 me if those were gunshots that he just heard. I asked [REDACTED] what he heard and he said it sounded  
21 like a lot of gunshots going off. I asked [REDACTED] if the school was locked down and he said it was. I  
22 told [REDACTED] to keep the school locked down until further notice and he confirmed he would keep the  
23 school locked down.

24  
25 I notified Officer Szmurlo via the radio I was positioned at the north end of Dixon High School and  
26 asked if he wanted me to remain there or respond to the scene. Officer Szmurlo requested I respond to  
27 the east side of Hall Park to secure the crime scene.

28  
29 I responded to Hall Park via East Chestnut Street which is on the west side of Hall Park. To access the  
30 east side of the park, I drove onto the pedestrian path next to the skate park and through the park to the  
31 east side of the park. As I approached the east parking lot, I saw Lt. Cordova's vehicle parked on the  
32 pedestrian path and Officer Siebert's patrol vehicle parked in the east parking lot facing eastbound. I  
33 parked behind Lt. Cordova's vehicle and exited my vehicle. I obtained crime scene tape from my vehicle  
34 to secure the scene. Officer Siebert was walking back towards his patrol vehicle at this time and I asked

35 him if he was okay. Officer Siebert told me he was okay and he sat in Lt. Cordova's vehicle. Lt.  
36 Cordova took my crime scene tape and marked off the crime scene which blocked the entrance to Hall  
37 Park from South Seventh Street and extended through the park towards the swimming pool.

38  
39 I made an initial walkthrough of the scene and observed several bullet holes in the back of Officer  
40 Siebert's patrol vehicle. The left tail light was broken, there was a bullet hole in the back of the vehicle  
41 on the driver's side, and the rear glass window was shattered with several holes in it. Through the  
42 window I could see holes through the acrylic cage inside the patrol vehicle. I took initial photographs of  
43 the scene and Officer Siebert's patrol vehicle.

44  
45 Officer Szmurlo advised me the suspect, identified as (S) [REDACTED], dropped a backpack in the  
46 park as he was running towards the swimming pool. I located a blue and black Wilson duffle bag in the  
47 field northwest of a northbound/southbound pedestrian path. Lt. Willingmyre marked the bag with a  
48 piece of evidence tape and I photographed the bag and its location.

49  
50 The Solano County District Attorney's Office was notified and several DA Investigators responded to  
51 the scene to conduct the officer involved shooting investigation. Supervising DA Investigator created  
52 several teams and assigned parts of the investigation to the teams of officers. I was teamed with DA  
53 Investigator Ted Jones and we were assigned to interview several witnesses who were waiting in the  
54 office at the Dixon High School. We exited the crime scene to conduct further investigation.

1 On 10/8/14 at approximately 0919 hours I was notified by Lt Cordova of an officer involved shooting.  
2 Lt Cordova was gathering information of the event as it unfolded and did not provide details at the time,  
3 other than to inform me that inform me all officers involved in the incident were physically unharmed.  
4  
5 I responded to Dixon PD from my residence. While en route, I contacted Solano Dispatch to request  
6 additional information on the incident as it became available. Dispatch told me there was a juvenile  
7 suspect in custody for the shooting. Dispatch named [REDACTED] as the individual in custody.  
8 I am familiar with S-[REDACTED] from an incident that occurred at [REDACTED] a week prior to  
9 this incident, while I was working as a patrol sergeant.

10  
11 *Previous incident in summary:*

12 S-[REDACTED] had been suspended from [REDACTED] for bringing alcohol to the school. I contacted S-  
13 [REDACTED] in the vice principal's office at the school where I was introduced to S-[REDACTED] S-  
14 [REDACTED] appeared upset. S-[REDACTED] head was down, his hands were in his lap and he spoke in  
15 a tone that was reserved and low. S-[REDACTED] eyes were red and puffy, as if he had been upset. S-  
16 [REDACTED] told me he had done something wrong and he was worried that his father was going to be  
17 disappointed in him. S-[REDACTED] told me "I can't go home." "I'm not going back." When I inquired  
18 as to why, S-[REDACTED] told me he was ashamed and did not know how he could face his father. S-  
19 [REDACTED] told me he had stolen the alcohol bottle that he took to school, from Safeway. S-[REDACTED]

34 work hard for the store. The manager told S- [REDACTED] that the store would not prosecute him and he  
35 could help Safeway by picking up trash in the parking lot in preparation for a yearly inspection.  
36 I transported S- [REDACTED] back to his residence and released him into [REDACTED] custody. No  
37 charges were filed in the incident.

38  
39 Upon arrival at Dixon PD on 10/8/14, I assisted with multiple areas of this investigation. This  
40 supplement will consist of my contact and interview of S- [REDACTED], which occurred at approximately  
41 1903 hours, after I removed him from the detention area. I conducted my interview with S- [REDACTED]  
42 in the Dixon PD interview room, after activating the department's audio-video recorder. I was joined in  
43 the interview by Solano County DA Investigator G. Myer. I later booked a DVD-R recording of the

68 I began speaking with S- [REDACTED] about his community service at Safeway. The following is a  
69 summary of my conversation with S- [REDACTED] regarding this incident after an implied waiver of  
70 Miranda:

71  
72 S- [REDACTED] STATEMENT IN SUMMARY:

73 S- [REDACTED] has had problems with his dad and has gotten to the point that he is "done" with his dad.  
74 S- [REDACTED] didn't feel like he was fixing anything with his father. S- [REDACTED] went to wrestling  
75 practice after school on 10/7/14 and then came home. S- [REDACTED] left around 8 PM and then walked  
76 around Dixon all night. Things were going through S- [REDACTED] head. S- [REDACTED] just wanted to  
77 "get out of here." S- [REDACTED] did not really see anyone while he was walking around. S- [REDACTED]  
78 has not seen his ex girl friend for a while either. S- [REDACTED] did not have his cell phone with him,  
79 because it was taken away for punishment. S- [REDACTED] does not really use any other means of  
80 communication with peers. S- [REDACTED] uses a Gmail account for his homework, but not really for  
81 any other reasons. S- [REDACTED] has used his mom's [REDACTED] desktop(which is slow), his brother's  
82 laptop(which is slow) and his mom's work laptop.

83  
84 S- [REDACTED] gets along with his little brother [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. S- [REDACTED] can only take  
85 so much of his dad and his dad can only take so much of him. Since the last incident at school, S-  
86 [REDACTED] has not been able to talk to his dad and has refrained from speaking much with [REDACTED]. S-  
87 [REDACTED] feels "pretty bad" about the situation.

89 S- [REDACTED] told me on 10/7/14 he walked around on the street all night after he left, until this  
90 morning. S- [REDACTED] did not go back to his residence on [REDACTED] at all after he left. When I

101 leaking, I put it on my back and left." I asked S- [REDACTED] why he had the gun with him. S-  
102 [REDACTED] stated "Protection, just to have it."

103  
104 I asked S- [REDACTED] if he was thinking of killing himself. S- [REDACTED] stated "It crossed my mind. I  
105 used to have problems with that." I asked S- [REDACTED] if he was thinking about killing himself last  
106 night. S- [REDACTED] nodded. I asked S- [REDACTED] how he was going to kill himself. S- [REDACTED]  
107 stated "Shoot myself in the head." I asked S- [REDACTED] how he got the gun. S- [REDACTED] said "I took  
108 it out of the safe. It was unlocked." S- [REDACTED] told me he did not know where the key was. I asked  
109 S- [REDACTED] how many guns he had with him, he stated: "I had one revolver and one other pistol." I

135 and said "what's up" to them but didn't have any extended conversations. S- [REDACTED] told me he  
136 didn't remember anyone he talked to aside from a student named [REDACTED] and her boyfriend and a student  
137 named [REDACTED]. S- [REDACTED] didn't remember anyone else because he was "pretty full of emotion." I  
138 asked S- [REDACTED] if he talked to anyone. S- [REDACTED] told me he talked to [REDACTED] and said "man  
139 I'm just done with it, I just might have to... I'm sick of it." I told her that she didn't understand and that I  
140 had been dealing with this for four years and was emotionally broken down every day.

141  
142 I asked S- [REDACTED] when he was walking around talking to people, where the gun was. S-  
143 [REDACTED] stated "In my pants." S- [REDACTED] stood and pointed to his right hip and waistband area  
144 and stated "Like that." S- [REDACTED] told me he had the gun there the whole night. S- [REDACTED] told  
145 me he didn't tell anyone he had the gun or that he wanted to hurt anyone. I asked S- [REDACTED] if he  
146 ever told anyone that he wanted to hurt his dad. S- [REDACTED] stated "I'm pretty sure I have sometimes."

170 and his direction of travel. S- [REDACTED] wrote his initials on the paper and I collected it as evidence.  
171 S- [REDACTED] described his initial confrontation with Siebert, running away, shooting while running  
172 away, taking fire from Officer Siebert and throwing his backpack down while fleeing and shooting. S-  
173 [REDACTED] described pulling a second magazine for his gun out of his pocket with his right hand while  
174 he held the gun with his left. S- [REDACTED] described ejecting the empty magazine because he fired all

188 I asked S- [REDACTED] if he had ever seen the gun he had or used it before. I asked S- [REDACTED] if he  
189 practiced loading and unloading magazines in the gun. S- [REDACTED] told me he did, the night prior to  
190 the incident. I asked S- [REDACTED] if he was envisioning anything while he was practicing loading the  
191 gun. S- [REDACTED] stated:"I was envisioning, well, if I ended up getting like, my dad comes by and like  
192 I might have to, either run, or if he's got his gun I'm gonna have to see who's gonna die first. If he's  
193 gonna shoot me or I'm gonna shoot him."

195 I asked S- [REDACTED]: Did he ever tell you he was going to shoot you with a gun?  
196 I think he said he was gonna go out and leave me in the dessert, or he would bury my in the dessert and

204 on me. That's bad. And then I was kinda ditching too.

205 GIOVANETTI: Could you see the officers face before you started shooting at him?

239 [REDACTED] described Officer Siebert pull past him, stop his vehicle and then get out.

241 S- [REDACTED]: He was like what are you doing? And that's when I got it, got it out .

242 GIOVANETTI: He wasn't like being mean to you?

243 S- [REDACTED]: No he was like what are you doing and that's when I went pop pop pop pop pop pop.

244 GIOVANETTI: OK. And he didn't point his gun at you?

258 I showed S- [REDACTED] a photo of Officer Siebert's police car with bullet holes in it. I asked S-

259 [REDACTED] what he thought would happen to an officer if they were seated in the car. S- [REDACTED]

260 stated : "They would be dead." I asked S- [REDACTED] where the bullets would have hit them. S-

261 [REDACTED] stated: "right in the back, the back of the head, anywhere upper torso."

262 GIOVANETTI: And that's what you were aiming for?

263 S- [REDACTED]: I just shot. I didn't. I just shot. I didn't aim, aim for him. I just shot shot shot shot shot.

265 S- [REDACTED] told me he ran after that and he knew he needed to reload.

266

267 S- [REDACTED] told me he knows the difference between violent video games and shooting someone in  
268 real life with a firearm. S- [REDACTED] also told me he knows the difference between violent movies and  
269 and real life(see video interview).

1 On 10-8-2014 at approximately 1308 hours, Solano County District Attorney Investigator Jerry Sanchez  
2 and I interviewed Dixon Police Officer Dustin Siebert regarding an officer involved shooting that  
3 occurred earlier in the morning. The interview took place in the interview room at Dixon Police  
4 Department. The interview was recorded by both audio and video and downloaded to a DVD. Also  
5 present were attorneys Joshua Olander, Erich Knorr, and Jay Mark, all with Mastagni Law Office.

6  
7 Officer Siebert reported the following in summary:

8  
9 On this day Officer Siebert was assigned to Patrol. His call sign was 6L20. His work hours were 0600-  
10 1800 hours. He has been a police officer in the City of Dixon for about 3 ½ months. He successfully  
11 completed a field training process of about 12 weeks. Prior to that, he was employed by Paradise Police  
12 Department for one year and 11 months primarily as a patrolman. And prior to that he was employed by  
13 Memphis Police Department for 3 years and 11 months where his assignment was uniformed patrol.

14  
15 Prior to this incident Officer Siebert had not been involved in an officer involved shooting. But he was  
16 the first officer to arrive on scene after another officer had been involved in a shooting and he completed  
17 the primary report (that incident was not with Dixon Police Department).

18  
19 Officer Siebert does not have military experience.

20  
21 On this day, Officer Siebert's work attire was a full uniform. It consisted of a shirt with a Dixon Police  
22 Department patch on both shoulders, his name tag, badge, duty belt with his duty weapon, handcuffs,  
23 ASP, radio, flashlight, and key holder. His assigned weapon was a GLOCK 21, .45 caliber. It had 13  
24 rounds in the magazine and one in the chamber. He had two magazines fully loaded with 13 rounds  
25 each in his ammo pouch.

26  
27 Officer Siebert's assigned vehicle was a marked patrol vehicle. It had lights and sirens. It contained a  
28 radio, shotgun, and his duty bag. There was a patrol rifle in the vehicle. The rifle was not his. It  
29 belonged to another officer that is also assigned to the vehicle. Officer Siebert had not been through the  
30 qualification at Dixon PD for the use of the patrol rifle. He was qualified at his prior two police  
31 departments. He does not use the rifle here and it was not another tool at his disposal on this day. He  
32 was, however, qualified to use the shotgun.

33  
34 Prior to today's shift, Officer Siebert woke up at 5 AM and he had slept for just over 5 hours.

36 Officer Siebert is not assigned a particular beat.

37

38 On this particular incident, Officer Siebert was dispatched as a back-up officer. He responded from the  
39 Police Department to Hall Park in a patrol vehicle. The call came out as a 415 (disturbance) possibly  
40 involving a weapon. He received information that a possible firearm was involved and multiple calls  
41 were coming in.

42

43 Officer Siebert saw the primary officer travel down South 1<sup>st</sup> Street. By the direction the primary officer  
44 passed him, he knew the other officer was going to enter Hall Park's west entrance. Officer Siebert  
45 continued to Hall Park's north entrance. He entered the north entrance and continued southbound along  
46 the west side of the park to see if he could locate the subject described in the call.

47

48 Officer Siebert saw the other officer enter the park from the west entrance and turn southbound toward  
49 the high school. Where the other officer entered the park (west entrance) is a parking area. Officer  
50 Siebert decided to drive through the parking area and go across the park to the other side (east side).  
51 The subject's last known location was the skate park (located next to the mentioned parking area and  
52 within Hall Park). As Officer Siebert drove over a curb to enter a walking path he saw a subject walking  
53 out of the bathroom who matched the suspect description provided by dispatch. The subject walked  
54 around the west side of the bathroom and then walked eastbound. Officer Siebert continued driving on  
55 the walking path. The suspect crossed over the path in front of Officer Siebert, he was about 75 yards  
56 away. The subject walked eastbound through a baseball field. Officer Siebert continued traveling on  
57 the walking path. Officer Siebert asked Dispatch for a description of the suspect. Dispatch told him it  
58 was a male, with a black sweatshirt with possibly a Jack Daniels logo on the front, blue sweats, about 6'  
59 tall, brown hair, and carrying a large bag or backpack. He told Dispatch that he would be out with the  
60 subject that matched the description on the east side of the park. At that time he was driving over the  
61 curb (from the walking path to the east parking area of Hall Park). He stopped. Put the vehicle into  
62 park and opened the driver's side door. As he was exiting the vehicle he glanced over his shoulder to  
63 look through the back windows of the vehicle and see where the suspect was coming from, to see if he  
64 would come up from the passenger side or come around the driver's side. At that split second he saw  
65 him, the suspect was actually coming across the rear of the vehicle, right behind the vehicle. At that  
66 moment Officer Siebert started hearing shots. About the third shot was when Officer Siebert saw glass  
67 and some glass hit him. That was the point he realized he was being shot at by this person. At the same

68 moment he was stuck between his car and the open driver's side door. The suspect was coming around;  
69 walking straight passed the rear of the vehicle and still shooting.

70

71 Officer Siebert didn't know how he wasn't hit yet. He didn't feel anything. He didn't know if he had  
72 been shot or just didn't feel it. He was scared for his life. He thought that was going to be it for him  
73 because he was stuck and had nowhere to run. The suspect continued moving northbound from the  
74 vehicle and then in a northwest direction as he was still shooting at Officer Siebert.

75

76 Officer Siebert moved around the car door and to the front passenger side of the vehicle. For a second  
77 he lost sight of suspect, but he could still hear shots being fired. Officer Siebert didn't know if the  
78 suspect was coming back to the passenger side of the vehicle. He didn't know the suspect's intent. Still,  
79 shots were being fired. Officer Siebert couldn't see the suspect. Officer Siebert started to make a wide  
80 approach in front of the vehicle. That's when he saw the suspect walking northwest in the grass area at  
81 a slight angle away from him. But the suspect was still turned and firing shots at Officer Siebert. That  
82 was when Officer Siebert returned fire and shot at the suspect.

83

84 As the subject ran away he was turned and shooting at Officer Siebert. Officer Siebert remembered that  
85 at about his third shot at the suspect he saw the suspect's body twist toward one side. That was about  
86 the time the suspect turned completely around and started running. Officer Siebert could see the gun in  
87 the suspect's right hand. The suspect ran about 50 yards and dropped the bag he was carrying. Officer  
88 Siebert chased the suspect across a field. He already said on the radio that shots were fired and he was  
89 running eastbound through the park. That's when the other officer and detective saw him and drove their  
90 vehicles across the grass toward the suspect. At that point Officer Siebert realized the suspect still had  
91 the gun. He didn't know if the suspect was going to stop, turn around and start shooting. He realized he  
92 was running through an open field behind the suspect with no cover. He backed off, slowed down and  
93 started moving down the tree line so he would have cover. That was when the detective and officer got  
94 the suspect at gunpoint. The suspect dropped the gun and got down on the ground. Officer Siebert  
95 handcuffed the suspect.

97 Officer Siebert did not remember the time of call for this incident. He estimated his response from the  
98 Station to the north entrance of Hall Park to be about two minutes. When Officer Siebert initially pulled  
99 into the north entrance he contacted a City employee near the pool. Officer Siebert asked him if he saw  
100 anyone with a black sweatshirt, blue sweats and a large bag. The City worker said no. Dustin continued  
101 southbound towards the skate park.

103 During further questioning of this incident Officer Siebert reported that he checked the skate park and no  
104 one matching the suspect description was there. He drove into the parking area on the north side of the  
105 skate park. He had in mind to get on the walking path and cut across the park to see if the suspect was  
106 there. As soon as he started driving up the curb onto the walking path he saw the suspect come out of  
107 the bathroom and walk around the north side (of the building). Officer Siebert was about 50 yards away.  
108 He lost sight of him. Then the suspect appeared from the other side (of the bathroom). The suspect  
109 started walking through the field. Officer Siebert was driving about 5 mph, he was idling. He again  
110 asked dispatch the suspect's description to make sure it matched. The suspect was walking straight  
111 across the baseball diamond and Officer Siebert was parallel with him when dispatch gave him the  
112 description. The subject matched the description. Officer Siebert and the suspect were both moving  
113 eastbound. The suspect was carrying a bag. The suspect's demeanor looked like he was walking home  
114 or wherever he was going. There was nothing that threw up a red flag. Officer Siebert passed the  
115 suspect. He continued and pulled off the curb. He could see the suspect walk toward where his vehicle  
116 was at. He lost sight of the suspect as he told dispatch that he was out with him on the east side of the  
117 park. As he was in the process of stepping out of the vehicle he looked over his left shoulder, looking  
118 back through the back windows to see where the suspect was coming. That was when he saw the suspect  
119 coming toward the rear passenger side of his vehicle and then cut straight across the rear of the vehicle.

122 Officer Siebert does not know if the suspect ran up on him to close the gap and get him by surprise or if  
123 he was going a bit slower than what he thought he was and the suspect was able to keep up with him as  
124 he pulled off the curb. When the suspect started firing, Officer Siebert could see the suspect come out  
125 from behind the vehicle. He said the suspect was about 10 feet from the rear of the vehicle. He heard  
126 three shots for sure before he realized that he was being shot at by the person. From that point on he  
127 could still hear shots being fired but couldn't figure why he wasn't hit and how he was going to get out  
128 of this V (area between the vehicle and open driver's door) to safety. The first three shots by the suspect  
129 were fast, rapid fire. The first two he didn't think of as being gunshots. It didn't click. But on the third  
130 he remembered the glass hitting him. Right after the third one he saw the suspect come out where he  
131 could actually see him again. That's when he saw the gun in the suspect's hand. Officer Siebert was out  
132 of the vehicle and standing next to the rear door when he felt the glass hit him. He was squared up  
133 toward the suspect. The suspect was walking northbound and shooting at him. Officer Siebert backed  
134 up and hit the door. That's when he rolled around the door and went to the front of his vehicle.

136 Officer Siebert thought he was going to be dead. He thought he was definitely going to die. When the  
137 glass started hitting him he realized the suspect was shooting at him.

138  
139 When he heard the shots and glass start hitting him, Officer Siebert crouched down and backed-up, he  
140 backed up against the door. The whole time he tried getting his gun out of its holster. It seemed like it  
141 was hung-up on something. He rolled moved the door and went to the front of the vehicle and that's  
142 when he was able to get his gun out.

143  
144 The suspect shot at Officer Siebert 8 to 9 times. He said he was at least 30 yards away from the suspect  
145 when he returned fire.

146  
147 The suspect ran in the northwest direction. The detective and K-9 officer moved northbound through  
148 the ball field towards the suspect. When they pulled up the suspect had stopped and turned around.  
149 Officer Siebert heard the other officers give the suspect directions to drop the gun and get on the ground.  
150 The suspect complied by dropping the gun and getting on the ground face down with his hands behind  
151 his back. The other officers held him there at gunpoint for about 20 seconds. Officer Siebert holstered  
152 his gun then handcuffed the suspect.

153  
154 Officer Siebert said that after he took off his uniform an Investigator with the DA's Office photographed  
155 the uniform.

156  
157 Upon my request, Officer Siebert drew a picture on a piece of yellow lined paper of where the suspect  
158 was shooting from in relation to him and his vehicle. He signed and dated the drawing.

159  
160 Upon questions from a Mastagni Law Firm attorney, Officer Siebert indicated he was actively taking  
161 fire from the suspect at the moment he fired his weapon. And he felt his life was in danger when he first  
162 fired his weapon.

163  
164 The interview concluded at approximately 1401 hours. End of statement.

4 from East Mayes Street. I saw Dixon Police Officers on scene in the north area of the park, near the  
5 swimming pool. I was asked by Lt. Ron Willingmyre to respond to Officer Siebert's patrol vehicle and  
6 secure it.

7  
8 I responded to Officer Siebert's vehicle. It was located in the east parking lot of the Hall Park. I parked  
9 my vehicle on the cement pathway located behind Officer Siebert's patrol vehicle. The back of the  
10 patrol vehicle appeared to have been shot by gunfire. I saw multiple shell casings on the ground to the  
11 rear of the vehicle. I saw multiple shell casings on the ground to the front of the vehicle as well. I began  
12 to secure the scene by putting up crime scene tape and cordoning off that area of the park. Lt.  
13 Willingmyre assisted in putting up crime scene tape, see his supplemental report.

14  
15 I short while later Detective Geisser arrived to my location, see his supplemental report.

16  
17 A while later, Chief Cox and Investigators from the Solano County District Attorney's Office arrived to  
18 my location. It was determined that DA Investigator Jerry Sanchez and I would interview Officer  
19 Siebert, Officer Szmurlo, and Detective Cooper. We later conducted those interviews at Dixon Police  
20 Department; see my supplemental reports documenting noted interviews.

1 On 10/8/14 at approximately 1254 hours, I was on patrol in the City of Dixon. I was wearing a full  
2 uniform and doubled with Officer Melton. I was assigned to assist with a detail from earlier in the day.  
3 Sgt. Tegeler requested that Officer Melton and I transport (S) [REDACTED] to North Bay Hospital  
4 in Vacaville to ensure he was fully medically cleared. I was advised by Sgt. Tegeler that [REDACTED]  
5 might have possibly sustained a gunshot wound in a previous exchange of gunfire with Officer Siebert.  
6 He stated that Dixon Fire Dept already cleared him medically however we wanted to ensure he had been  
7 looked at by the hospital due to the seriousness of the incident.

8  
9 I took custody of [REDACTED] and transported him to North Bay Hospital in Vacaville. I activated my  
10 body mounted recorder for the duration of the hospital visit. There are three video clips total and the  
11 video stops at the very end due to the memory card becoming full and the camera shutting off  
12 automatically.

13  
14 After arriving at the hospital, I advised the staff the reason for our visit. We were escorted to an exam  
15 room and waited for [REDACTED] to be examined. At approximately 1327 hours, a physician's assistant  
16 entered the exam room and asked what happened. Based on the fact that I was not originally on scene  
17 and did not know the full details of [REDACTED] injuries, I advised the staff member he would have to  
18 ask [REDACTED] directly. He then asked [REDACTED] what had occurred. [REDACTED] stated "I had an  
19 incident. Shots were fired, I guess you could say and uh, I got grazed." He had a smile on his face and  
20 appeared to be happy about the overall situation. He then stood up to show the staff member his scratch.  
21 His clothes were not torn in any way and did not have a hole in them that would be consistent with the  
22 abrasion being a bullet wound. The staff member asked if there were holes through any other articles of  
23 clothing [REDACTED] had been wearing. [REDACTED] replied "I didn't see anything else." The staff  
24 member began asking more follow up questions as to how [REDACTED] received the wound.  
25 [REDACTED] replied "I ran and I was like running and uh I heard the shot and then BAM, it stung right  
26 there and I was like oh crap and I just dropped my bag and took off." While telling the story,  
27 [REDACTED] again began to smile as if he was proud of the incident. [REDACTED] stated he had no pain

1 On 10/8/14 after 1400 hours, I responded to 1150 Weyand Way along with Solano County DA Inv. G  
2 Meyer to contact [REDACTED] father. I told [REDACTED] that his son was involved  
3 in an incident at Dixon HS and asked him if he would come to the police department to speak with me.  
4 [REDACTED] was cooperative, but upset and worried about his son. [REDACTED] asked me if S-[REDACTED]  
5 had taken a gun to school. [REDACTED] told me he was asking about this because he had received an email  
6 from one of S-[REDACTED] teachers that he had missed his appointment with her that morning for  
7 independent study. [REDACTED] then heard from his girlfriend [REDACTED] that there had been an  
8 incident at the high school in which a student had taken a gun to school. [REDACTED] ran upstairs to make  
9 sure that all of his firearms were accounted for, but found that there was a 22 cal revolver missing. All  
10 of [REDACTED] guns were locked in a safe except for a few that he had recently inherited. There was no  
11 ammunition accessible for the any of the firearms because it was locked in the same safe as his other  
12 firearms in his bedroom.

13  
14 [REDACTED] agreed to come to Dixon PD and speak with me about his son. [REDACTED] spoke with me in  
15 an interview room while I had the video surveillance system activated. I later booked the DVD disk of  
16 that interview into evidence at Dixon PD. During the course of the interview, [REDACTED] told me the  
17 following in summary, regarding his son S-[REDACTED]:

19 [REDACTED] STATEMENT IN SUMMARY:  
20 [REDACTED] is separated from S-[REDACTED] mother, who currently lives in [REDACTED]. During the summer  
21 of 2011, [REDACTED] got a phone call from S-[REDACTED] mom who told [REDACTED] she wanted S-

35 I met [REDACTED] and we decided to combine forces. She had a kid and I did so it worked out. [REDACTED] has

63 into that. There's no way in hell he's finding that key. The two guns in there were a Springfield 40 cal

9 Narrative

11 On October 8, 2014 at approximately 1505 hours, Solano County DA Investigator Jerry Sanchez and I  
12 interviewed Dixon Police Officer Kevin Szmurlo. He was accompanied by attorney Jay Mark of the  
13 Mastagni Law Firm. The interview took place in the interview room at Dixon Police Department. The  
14 interview was in regards to an officer involved shooting that happened earlier in the day in which  
15 Officer Szmurlo assisted in the apprehension of the suspect. The interview was recorded by both audio  
16 and video.

18 Officer Szmurlo reported the following in summary:

20 Officer Szmurlo has been an officer for 7 years. On this day he worked patrol and was the on-duty  
21 supervisor. He has been employed with the City of Dixon for 7 years. His call sign today was 6K1.  
22 He's been on day shift all of this year. When he started work this day he was attired in the same manner  
23 as in this interview (police uniform).

25 On this day he stopped at the gas station to fuel his patrol vehicle in the 1900 block of North 1<sup>st</sup> Street.  
26 Dispatch radioed him and Officer Siebert to a call of a 415 with a weapon at Hall Park. He responded to  
27 the scene with his lights and siren on. Dispatch provided a description of the subject as a male juvenile,  
28 6' tall, wearing a black sweatshirt with Jack Daniels writing on the front, blue sweatpants, and he had a  
29 firearm.

31 Officer Szmurlo approached Hall Park from East Chestnut Street. Then he turned right and drove  
32 southbound through the parking lot of the park. Once he reached the south end of the park he turned  
33 around and proceeded back north, looking for someone matching the description. He didn't see any  
34 other officers but he heard Officer Siebert radio that he was on scene at the north end of the park. When

35 he was driving northbound he was scanning the park. He saw a Public Works employee. Officer  
36 Szmurlo stopped and advised him that he had a call of someone with a gun. He provided him with a  
37 description and to call the police right away if he saw someone matching the description. He proceeded  
38 northbound in the park. Then he heard approximately 10 gunshots. The gunshots he heard did not  
39 sound like automatic gunfire. It was slower than that. It sounded like it was coming from the east side  
40 of the park. He didn't hear anything right away on the radio. He continued northbound and he was  
41 going to proceed to the east side of the park. Before he turned east he heard Officer Siebert on the radio  
42 advising there were shots fired. Just as he passed the skate park he turned right to proceed eastbound  
43 and that's when he saw the suspect running in a northwest direction. Officer Siebert put on the radio the  
44 suspect was running westbound through the park. Officer Szmurlo figured the suspect was coming  
45 toward him. When he saw that individual and saw that he matched the description he believed it was  
46 him, that was the suspect. He was approximately 150 yards away when Officer Szmurlo first saw him.  
47 He was in his vehicle when he saw the suspect. The suspect was at about 10 o'clock if viewing from his  
48 vehicle. The suspect was to the left of Officer Szmurlo's vehicle and running in a direction away from  
49 his vehicle. The suspect was running diagonally through the park in a northwest direction. Officer  
50 Szmurlo did not see him carrying anything. At that time he did not see any weapons on him. Officer  
51 drove onto the curb and proceeded to drive northbound through the softball fields to pursue the suspect.  
52 The suspect was in a full sprint and he did not see the suspect look back. As they approached the south  
53 end of the swimming pool he stopped his patrol vehicle approximately 30 yards from the suspect. At  
54 that time the suspect had just begun to start walking next to the bathrooms at the swimming pool.  
55 Officer Szmurlo began to exit his patrol vehicle to contact the suspect. The suspect turned toward  
56 Officer Szmurlo and at that point Officer Szmurlo saw the gun in the suspect's right hand and it was  
57 lowered, down at his right side. Officer Szmurlo drew his firearm and had it up and ready. He ordered  
58 the suspect to drop the gun multiple times. At first the suspect slowly began to raise the gun up in  
59 Officer Szmurlo's direction to the point that Officer Szmurlo saw the muzzle of the gun. Then the  
60 suspect paused for approximately 2 or 3 seconds. Then the suspect released the gun and it fell to the  
61 ground. The suspect got down onto his stomach and put his hands behind his back.

62  
63 The suspect had been facing Officer Szmurlo when he started to raise the gun up with his right hand. He  
64 was approximately 30 yards away. The suspect raised the gun just enough that Officer Szmurlo was  
65 able to see the muzzle of the gun. Officer Szmurlo had told the suspect to drop the gun multiple times.  
66 There was hesitation on the part of the suspect. Officer Szmurlo thought the suspect had thought about  
67 engaging in a fire fight with him. Officer Szmurlo's mindset at the time was he thought the suspect was  
68 going to shoot him. He was fearing for his life at that time. After the suspect raised the gun Officer

69 Szmurlo saw him pause. Officer Szmurlo continued to yell for him to drop the gun and the suspect  
70 dropped the gun. Officer Szmurlo was not able to tell what the suspect's facial expressions were when  
71 he was telling the suspect to drop the gun and he was raising it. He was more focused on the gun than  
72 the suspect's face.

73  
74 After the suspect dropped the gun Officer Szmurlo waited for the other officers. He made sure the other  
75 officers were ready to approach. He started to approach the suspect and he repeatedly told him to not  
76 touch the gun or he would shoot. The suspect remained in the position on his stomach with his hands  
77 behind his back. Officer Szmurlo approached the tree closest to the suspect, just south of him. He  
78 stopped and used it as cover. At that point Detective Cooper and Officer Siebert also approached and  
79 Officer Siebert handcuffed the suspect while Officer Szmurlo kept his gun aimed at the suspect.

80  
81 Earlier, when the suspect had started raising the gun and then dropped the gun, Officer Szmurlo  
82 maintained the 30 yard distance and stayed at his patrol car. He had angled his patrol vehicle so that the  
83 suspect was facing the front passenger corner of the vehicle, that way Officer Szmurlo could use the  
84 engine block as cover. He stood behind the open driver's door. After the suspect dropped the gun  
85 Officer Szmurlo told the suspect to not move, don't reach for the weapon, and if he moved he would  
86 shoot him. The suspect did not say anything.

87  
88 Detective Cooper had his own vehicle and arrived at the same time Officer Szmurlo did and they  
89 contacted the suspect together. Detective Cooper was positioned approximately 15 yards to the right of  
90 Officer Szmurlo and about the same distance away from the suspect as Officer Szmurlo was. Officer  
91 Szmurlo was not focused on Officer Cooper and does not know if he used his door as cover. He just  
92 remembered Detective Cooper's car pulling up at the same time.

93  
94 Officer Szmurlo had kept his gun (aimed) on the suspect as he used the tree for cover. Detective Cooper  
95 and Officer Siebert both came from behind Officer Szmurlo on his right side and to the suspect. Officer  
96 Szmurlo approached while Officer Siebert handcuffed the suspect.

97  
98 The (suspect) gun was a black Springfield XD semi-automatic handgun.

99  
100 At the end of the interview, Officer Szmurlo's representative, Mark Joy, asked him if he discharged his  
101 weapon. He answered no. Joy asked Officer Szmurlo if the suspect was injured in any way. Officer  
102 Szmurlo said the suspect had a bright red, looked like a scratch or scrape, on the left side of his torso.

10 Narrative

12 On October 8, 2014 at approximately 1546 hours Solano County District Attorney's Office Investigator  
13 Jerry Sanchez and I interviewed Detective Glenn Cooper of the Dixon Police Department. The  
14 interview was regarding an officer involved shooting that occurred earlier in the day. Also present was  
15 Joshua Olander of the Mastagni Law Firm, he was present as Detective Cooper's legal counsel. The  
16 interview was recorded by both audio and video.

18 Detective Cooper reported the following in summary:

20 Detective Cooper has been with the Dixon Police Department off and on for 14-15 years. His  
21 assignment with the Dixon Police Department is Detective. His assignment in Investigations is general  
22 investigations. He has been in this assignment for a little over a month. He has approximately 18 years  
23 of law enforcement experience, as a police officer, as a detective, and about 4 years as a police sergeant.  
24 As a sergeant it was with Dixon Police Department.

26 It was around 9 o'clock, a little after 9 that he became aware of this incident. That was about the time he  
27 went out on a follow-up. He heard part of the call on the radio. He was doing some follow-up, talking  
28 to a witness. He heard some traffic on the radio. He was just clearing his follow-up. He heard one of  
29 the officers say Code 3. He asked Dispatch for the location and started heading that way. He did not  
30 hear the entirety of the original call. He knew where to respond to. They said [REDACTED] and it  
31 was a 415, person with a weapon, and the person was at Hall Park. He decided to go towards Hall Park.  
32 It took him within a couple minutes to get to Hall Park, 2 or 3 minutes. He entered Hall Park off of East  
33 Chestnut Street. He came in from the west side of the park. He believed the call said the person was  
34 near the skate park. He made a right towards the high school and the skate park was to his left. He

35 heard something about a backpack, juvenile. He saw a student walking with a blue backpack and blue  
36 shirt on. He immediately pulled up to that student and contacted him. He asked the student if he was  
37 involved in a fight. The student said no, he was walking to school. Detective Cooper asked if he could  
38 look in the student's backpack. The student opened his backpack. Detective Cooper looked inside the  
39 backpack and felt like the student was not involved. Detective Cooper was returning to his car when he  
40 heard Officer Siebert say he was out with the subject. And within a few seconds after that he heard  
41 rapid gunfire. Detective Cooper responded to the area where he heard the gunfire. He drove towards  
42 the east side of the park. Officer Siebert said he was out with the subject on the east side of the park.  
43 He didn't recall Officer Siebert saying anything else. That's where he heard the gunshots coming from.  
44 From that area he would have been turning eastbound towards the other end of Chestnut (Street), he  
45 turned towards that area. It sounded like quite a few gunshots. It was so rapid that he doesn't know if  
46 he could count them in his mind. When he heard the gunshots he thought crap, Officer Siebert had been  
47 ambushed. That's how fast it happened. It sounded like someone had unloaded on Officer Siebert.  
48 That's what was going through Detective Cooper's mind.

49  
50 When Detective Cooper arrived at Hall Park he didn't really see anything. He still never saw Officer  
51 Siebert's car. Where Detective Cooper turned in was between the softball fields and the skateboard park  
52 and the playground was in front of him, he was looking that way. He was looking for Officer Siebert.  
53 His concern was where Officer Siebert was at, was he okay. He was aiming his car that way. Then he  
54 heard Officer Siebert say he was chasing and he caught a glimpse of someone running across the park.  
55 Detective Cooper jumped the curb next to the softball fields and started driving through the park.  
56 Detective Cooper didn't see Officer Szmurlo but he recalled Officer Szmurlo going 10-97 (on-scene)  
57 there too. For some reason he knew Officer Szmurlo was in the area.

58  
59 Detective Cooper saw the subject running through the park. So he started driving toward the subject.  
60 The subject was going in a northwest direction. He was not close enough to see if the subject was  
61 carrying anything. The subject was just running. In the corner of his eye he could see Officer Siebert  
62 pursuing the subject on foot. Detective Cooper tried to get to the subject and get between him and  
63 Officer Siebert. His car wasn't cooperating. He was just trying to get there, sliding through the park  
64 trying to get there. About the time he caught up with the suspect he doubled into a group of trees near  
65 the swimming pool area of the park. The suspect veered off into the group of trees and Detective  
66 Cooper lost sight of him for a few seconds. He established contact with him again and he parked at the  
67 foot of the trees and exited his vehicle. To his left he saw Officer Szmurlo exiting his vehicle.  
68 Detective went from tree to tree as cover. As he approached he could see the suspect spin around and

69 stop running. He couldn't remember if the suspect was slow walking or actually came to a full stop.  
70 That's when Detective Cooper saw a weapon in the suspect's right hand. Detective Cooper was at least  
71 50 feet back when he saw the suspect carrying the weapon in his right hand. The suspect had the  
72 weapon to his side in his right hand. As the suspect turned toward Officer Szmurlo he heard Officer  
73 Szmurlo give commands. Detective Cooper gave him commands. As the suspect slowly turned  
74 Detective Cooper saw the weapon and the suspect immediately laid it down. Detective Cooper gave  
75 commands of, Stop or I'll shoot. He was yelling. Officer Szmurlo's commands were the same type of  
76 thing; stop, show us your hands, get on the ground. They were both yelling at the same time. When the  
77 commands were given the suspect was facing them. Detective Szmurlo could see Officer Szmurlo to his  
78 left. Officer Szmurlo was outside his vehicle. Detective Cooper remembered Officer Szmurlo approach  
79 as he approached. He doesn't remember actually seeing Officer Szmurlo approach but they were both  
80 right there. As Detective Cooper got up to the suspect he saw Officer Szmurlo to his left. He did not

98 was hurt. About that time he noticed the red mark on the suspect's back. He asked the suspect how that  
99 happened and the suspect said he was shot. He asked the suspect how he was shot. The suspect said the  
100 officer shot him. Detective Cooper saw the injury. It was like a graze wound. It wasn't gushing out  
101 blood, but it was red.

103 He started asking the suspect if anyone else was involved, were there any other kids with weapons, if he  
104 had another weapon. The suspect told him there was a .44 magnum inside the blue bag. Detective  
105 Cooper asked the suspect where the blue bag was. The suspect told him it was by the slides. Detective  
106 Cooper immediately put that over the radio, saying there was a second weapon.

107

108 The weapon Detective Cooper saw the suspect drop looked like a black semi-automatic pistol. He  
109 didn't take a good look at it. Officer Szmurlo secured it.

110

111 DA Investigator Sanchez asked Detective Cooper what he thought was going to happen when the  
112 suspect turned and faced him and Officer Szmurlo. Detective Cooper said he thought the suspect was  
113 going to encounter them. He thought the suspect was going to shoot at them. Investigator Sanchez  
114 asked Detective Cooper if he feared for his life at that time. Detective Cooper said yes. Investigator  
115 Sanchez asked Detective Cooper how close he was to shooting. Detective Cooper said he was still  
116 approaching. He was trying to get him in his sights because if he were to start shooting at Officer  
117 Szmurlo. He thought that the dog had been deployed. He was not going to let the suspect shoot Officer  
118 Szmurlo, he was not going to let him shoot the dog. As the suspect turned toward them he still had the  
119 gun in his hand. He was not sure if the suspect ever knew he was approaching him. He thought the  
120 suspect saw Officer Szmurlo so he was reacting to Officer Szmurlo. Detective Cooper could hear  
121 Officer Szmurlo tell the suspect to drop the gun. Detective Cooper was running up telling him to drop  
122 it. Probably about that time Detective Cooper was going to shoot him and the suspect put the gun down.

124 Detective responded to this call from the area of Valley Glen. He travelled northbound South 1<sup>st</sup> Street,  
125 made a right turn onto East Chestnut Street and travelled eastbound to the park.

127 I asked Detective Cooper if after the suspect was handcuffed did he or another officer call for medical  
128 aid. He said he thought Officer Szmurlo asked for the Fire Department to respond. The Fire  
129 Department showed up and spoke to the suspect, treated him and basically said the suspect did not want  
130 to go to the hospital and they released him back to the officers.

131

132 Joshua Olander asked some follow-up questions. He asked Detective Cooper if there was anyone else in  
133 the park when he saw the subject running through the park. Detective Cooper said he did not recall

4 wanted to talk or needed counseling about the shooting incident the day before. Later in the day at about  
5 1300 hrs, I was told by Police Chaplain Duvall that a potential character witness wanted to speak with  
6 the PD about the shooter. I responded to the school and meet his step-father in the school office and  
7 asked him if he wanted to sit in with me, while I spoke to his son and he declined my invitation.

8

9 I then spoke with [REDACTED] who told me the following in substance: I am pretty good friends with [REDACTED]  
10 [REDACTED] and I know the reasons he had the guns. [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] and his father did not get  
11 along very well; his father is mentally ill and has assaulted him about 3-4 times in the past and had  
12 broken his nose in the past. [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] stole his father guns the night before, because he  
13 was going to run away and wanted to "lie low" for awhile at an unknown friend's house in Dixon.  
14 [REDACTED] also wanted to keep the guns for protection.

15

16 I then asked [REDACTED] the following questions:

17 Q: Did [REDACTED] come to the school to shoot up the school?

18 A: No

19 Q: How many guns did he have?

20 A: Two

21 Q: How long has he had the guns?

22 A: He said he stole the guns from his dad's house the night before. He also said he did a "snatch-n-grab"

**FACTS:**

On 10-08-14 at approx. 0903 hours, I was advised that officers had been dispatched to Hall Park for a report of a subject with a gun.

I responded from the Dixon Police Department and as I was turning from West Mayes onto South bound South First Street, I heard on the radio that Officer Seibert had located the suspect. A few seconds later I head the reports of shots being fired over the radio. As I continued south bound on South First Street I heard that the suspect was running north bound through Hall Park. At that time I decided to enter the park from the north end since the suspect was heading in that direction. I turned east bound onto East Walnut Street, then north bound onto South Second Street, then east bound onto East Mayes Street. I continued east bound on East Mayes Street until I reached to north entrance into Hall Park. As I turned south bound into Hall Park I observed Officer Szmurlo and Det. Cooper at the south edge of the parking lot with their duty weapons out and pointed at a subject, (later identified as (S) [REDACTED], and (S) [REDACTED] was starting to lay down on the ground. As I turned into the parking lot area and stopped my unmarked vehicle, Officer Seibert and Detective Cooper had already approached (S) [REDACTED] and were placing handcuffs on him as he was lying on the ground.

I approached Officer Seibert and had him check himself to make sure that he had not been injured, which he had not been. I then asked where the shooting took place and he pointed out his patrol vehicle that was parked in the east parking lot of Hall Park. Seeing that this was a large crime scene and this was a public park I decided to close off the crime scene as quickly as possible. I took crime scene barrier tape out of the trunk of my unmarked unit and started closing off the crime scene. Lt. Cordova arrived on scene and assisted in putting up the barrier tape. Once the crime scene was fully closed off and due to the size of it and the size of the park I requested additional units from the Solano County Sheriff's Office to assist in crime scene preservation. Solano Deputies L. Vance, B. Williams and D. Grundy arrived and were assigned to the following areas. Deputy L. Vance was assigned to the east entrance into Hall Park, Deputy B. Williams was assigned to the north entrance to Hall Park and Deputy D. Grundy was assigned to the west entrance to Hall Park. Dixon Fire Department Captain R. Karlen arrived on scene and assisted with securing the south end of Hall Park next to the Dixon High School.

During this time Deputy L. Vance managed the crime scene log for this incident.

35 At approx. 0928 hours Chief Cox requested that the District Attorney's Officer Investigations Division  
36 be notified of the Officer Involved Shooting and request that they send a team to assist in the  
37 investigations. We were notified that several investigators would be responding to the scene.

38  
39 At approx. 0950 hours I called several agencies requesting a crime scene unit to assist in the processing  
40 of the scene but was unable to locate one to respond at that time. I also called several agencies  
41 requesting a laser scanner to document the area of the shooting. At approx. 1047 hours I was notified by  
42 the Department of Justice (DOJ) that they did have a laser scanning unit that would be responding from  
43 the Central Valley with an ETA of 2 ½ hours.

44  
45 At 1035 hours Solano County DA Investigators A. Dillon, J. Sanchez, V. Rister and T. Jones arrived on  
46 scene. I informed them of the incident that had taken place from the information that I had at that time.  
47 Solano County DA Investigator A. Dillon assigned tasks to all personal. I was assigned to oversee the  
48 crime scene security and to make sure the crime scene was processed for evidence. DA Investigator V.  
49 Rister was assigned to collect and book all of the evidence. She was provided a digital camera from the  
50 Dixon Police Department which she used during her investigation. (See V. Rister's supplemental report

53 At 1117 hours Chief Cox contacted the Sacramento Sheriff's Office and requested the use of their

56 photos of the crime scene.

1 On 10/8/14 at about 1000 hrs I requested CSO Nuno contact residents at the houses which back up to the  
2 parking lot on the east side of Hall Park to check on their welfare and see if any had witnessed this  
3 incident. I also asked CSO Nuno to ask the residents to check their houses and backyards for damage  
4 from stray bullets. CSO Nuno told me she checked the houses along South Seventh Street which back up  
5 to Hall Park and adjacent streets. CSO Nuno told me nobody was home at 260, 290, 300, 410, and 420  
6 South Seventh Street. Additionally, CSO Nuno provided me a list of persons she contacted who were  
7 home and witnessed some of this incident. I added those names and addresses to the witness list of  
8 persons who need to be contacted for a statement (see attached additional names forms).

9  
10 While I was inside the crime scene I made an initial walk through of the scene. I marked items of  
11 evidence I located with yellow evidence markers. I marked 10 shell casings I located at the scene near  
12 Officer Siebert's patrol car.

13  
14 CSO Gastelum was posted at the east entrance to Hall Park off of East Chestnut Street near South 7<sup>th</sup>  
15 Street to prevent entry into the crime scene. CSO Gastelum told me a male subject was waiting with her  
16 and he stated he witnessed the incident. I went to the east entrance to Hall Park and exited the crime  
17 scene to contact the witness. I contacted the witness who was identified with his California Driver's  
18 License as (W) [REDACTED]. I recorded my contact with [REDACTED] with my body worn digital video  
19 recorder. I asked [REDACTED] what he saw and he provided me with the following statement in summary:

23 I was driving southbound on South 7<sup>th</sup> Street and was stopped at the stop sign at the intersection

I got to the baseball fields this morning and there were two kids there. I recognized them when I got closer as [redacted] and [redacted] said you want to see something and I said sure. [redacted] pulled up his shirt and he had a black gun in his waist. [redacted] showed me another one which was a black revolver in the side pocket of the sports bag. I asked him if it was loaded and he said yeah. I told [redacted] to unload it and he took the bullets out of the one in his waist but not the revolver. He took the bullets out by pushing a button on the side and the magazine came out and then he cocked it back and the one in the chamber came out.

 260 On 10/8/14 at about 1730 hrs DA Investigator Ted Jones and I met with (W) [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] is  
 261 in a relationship with [REDACTED], (W) [REDACTED] and lives with them. I asked [REDACTED] to  
 262 tell me about [REDACTED] and their home life. [REDACTED] provided the following statement in summary:

263  
 264 (W) [REDACTED] STATEMENT:

265 [REDACTED] told me [REDACTED] is a very respectable and well behaved boy when he is around his father.  
 266 However, when [REDACTED] is around me it is different. About a month ago I was at Safeway with  
 267 [REDACTED] and we went down the alcohol aisle. [REDACTED] said "It would be really easy to steal alcohol  
 268 from Safeway." I confronted him about it and said we were law abiding citizens and we don't  
 269 behave like that. [REDACTED] said whatever and said if you're really fast you won't get caught. About  
 270 3-4 weeks later, [REDACTED] stole alcohol from Safeway and got caught.

271  
 272 [REDACTED] dad told him it was okay if he used swear words in appropriate situations. Following  
 273 that, [REDACTED] started constantly swearing around me. Whenever I confronted him about it, [REDACTED]  
 274 would say his father said it was okay. [REDACTED] behaves completely different when he is around me  
 275 but he is very well behaved around his father. [REDACTED] listens to his rap music and tries to be a  
 276 tough guy around me.

277  
 278 Just today, I was at my church and tried to set up some counseling to get [REDACTED] and his father,  
 279 [REDACTED] in together.

280  
 281  
 282 Yesterday, [REDACTED] was doing all of his homework and his chores but then all this other stuff was  
 283 going on behind the scenes.

284  
 285 When [REDACTED] stole the alcohol he had it hidden at the house. [REDACTED] was going to church,  
 286 spending time with the family, but there was no indication. [REDACTED] has talked about having  
 287 demons in his head. I've never dealt with something like that. I've been in [REDACTED] life for a  
 288 year but we have a connection. [REDACTED] says he is my protector and he has a good relationship  
 289 with my son, [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] always wants to impress everybody.

290  
 291 [REDACTED] would always complain of being sick, he missed a lot of school, and his grades fell.

292  
 293 I don't know what else to say but there are two sides to [REDACTED]. I don't know how to describe it.  
 294 He was always about me, he would always want to be with me, he would hang out with me and

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do his homework. I always told [REDACTED] he was doing good and told him to just stay out of trouble.

[REDACTED] has been suspended twice from school. [REDACTED] just returned to school on Monday (10/6/14). That suspension was from being caught at school with alcohol he stole from Safeway.

[REDACTED] had to go to Safeway and talk to them about what he did. I asked him how he felt and if he felt it when he had to go speak to them about it. [REDACTED] just said "yeah I felt it." I have never seen him cry.

[REDACTED] barely reacted to the Safeway incident at home. [REDACTED] spoke with him a lot about the incident and told him he needed to grow up and take responsibility. [REDACTED] told him he was disappointed.

[REDACTED] has been on restriction. [REDACTED] doesn't have any friends that have come to the house. I think [REDACTED] prefers to be around adults.

About 2 weeks ago, [REDACTED] started giving [REDACTED] some time to go spend time with his girlfriend at the park, despite being on restriction. [REDACTED] girlfriend had never come over to the house and I haven't met her. I don't know her name. [REDACTED] talked about her and said she was a nice girl. [REDACTED] hasn't said anything about her lately.

[REDACTED] is completely different around his dad. [REDACTED] has only had [REDACTED] for 4 years and he has been trying to shape him up. [REDACTED] quit his job to give [REDACTED] the attention he needs. I think [REDACTED] always felt there was something off about [REDACTED] and he is always trying to build him up to be a better person. [REDACTED] has that reputation when you do so many things your dad isn't going to trust you. [REDACTED] talks to [REDACTED] a lot. They have also fought in the past, just like I have fought with my kids. There is a lot of tension there. [REDACTED] wants to be just like his dad and is always trying to compete with him.

[REDACTED] has a lot of anger and was away from [REDACTED] for 7 years while he was overseas. [REDACTED] life was very bleak before [REDACTED] got him. [REDACTED] was with his mother before and she was always going from boyfriend to boyfriend and they would abuse him. [REDACTED] told me he was once locked in his room for days on end and he was not loved. [REDACTED] mom was always more concerned with herself and money.

I think there was a lot of pressure on [REDACTED] during the last couple weeks because [REDACTED] told him he had to get it together or he would go back to his mom.

The fights between [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were arguing and yelling. I saw one time back in February where they pushed and shoved each other.

 350 Detective Cooper. I entered the residence and went upstairs to [REDACTED] bedroom and assisted in the

**10/10/14 FOLLOW-UP**

On 10/10/14 at about 1300 hrs I contacted (W) [REDACTED] via telephone. I asked [REDACTED] if he would give consent for investigators to search the mobile phone we took as evidence. [REDACTED] told me he wants to know what is going on and will provide consent to search [REDACTED] mobile phone. I asked [REDACTED] if the phone belongs to him or [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] told me he bought the phone and pays for the service on the phone but allows [REDACTED] use it when he isn't in trouble. [REDACTED] told me he would provide me with a copy of his bill and would sign a consent to search form. [REDACTED] told me he was going to [REDACTED] arraignment and would contact me when that was over. I did not hear from [REDACTED] further.

**10/14/14 FOLLOW-UP**

On 10/14/14 I received a manila envelope which was hand delivered to the Dixon Police Department by an employee of the [REDACTED] and labeled "Det. Geisser". I opened the envelope and located school records for (S) [REDACTED] from [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] transferred to [REDACTED] in December 2013. [REDACTED] previously attended school in [REDACTED] California. School records indicate [REDACTED] was first enrolled in a California school in August 2013, when he was enrolled at [REDACTED]. I attached the school records to this report.

The school records for [REDACTED] showed [REDACTED] had been suspended from school 3 times while enrolled at [REDACTED] was suspended on [REDACTED] due to fighting. [REDACTED] was suspended this school year on [REDACTED] for fighting. [REDACTED] was suspended most recently on [REDACTED] for possession of alcohol at school. The most recent suspension had [REDACTED] returning to school on [REDACTED]. School attendance records indicate [REDACTED] attended school on [REDACTED].

At about 1000 hrs I contacted [REDACTED] via telephone. I told [REDACTED] I had not heard back from him and would like to meet so I could have him sign the consent to search form. [REDACTED] apologized and told me [REDACTED] attorney spoke with him after the arraignment on Friday. [REDACTED] told me [REDACTED] attorney told him not to give police any further information and not to provide consent to search anything else. [REDACTED] told me he wants to know what information may be on [REDACTED] phone but after speaking with [REDACTED] attorney he no longer can provide consent to search the phone.

On 10/14/14 at about 1500 hrs I met with Solano DA Investigator Ted Jones to conduct follow up interviews on this case. While preparing to conduct follow up interviews we were briefed by Sergeant Giovanetti that a new witness was contacted. Sergeant Giovanetti told me he contacted (W) [REDACTED] at Dixon High School yesterday, 10/13/14. Sergeant Giovanetti told me [REDACTED] was contacted due to her making statements to other students about the incident involving [REDACTED]. Sergeant Giovanetti briefed me that [REDACTED] was brought into the school office for making threats to people about "snitching" on [REDACTED]. Sergeant Giovanetti gave me a photo copy of a paper the school had [REDACTED] write what she had said on. [REDACTED] wrote the following two statements:

432 I know [REDACTED] because we had a class together. I don't know that much about him but we had  
433 some friends together.

437 school. We walk the same way. [REDACTED] told me he wanted to run way because his dad abuses  
438 him. [REDACTED] asked me if I knew anybody who would let him stay with them that night and I told

458 could have possibly said something if she knew about it.
